YQCA Reminders

REMINDER that all livestock kids are to be YQCA certified to show and to sell. It is one of their two required educational events. This includes beef, sheep, swine, and meat goats.

Any individual SELLING in the auction is now required to be certified. This includes rabbits, poultry, and dairy. This was put in to ensure that any drugs or feed additives have passed through the animal, and all withdrawal times have been met.

We are not, and can not require YQCA in the other species, only the ones that are selling in the auction. Ours is a premium sale usually, but the buyer can decide to take the animal and consume it.

This was a CYA enacted to preserve the integrity of the auction, as all products are meant for consumption by the buyer.

Llama project was excluded from this requirement, as they sell as a group and not individually. Also, many of the group have already met YQCA through other projects at the fair.

Please be sure to follow the instructions listed in the fair book. There are still opportunities to complete educational events before the fair. And if you have any questions please do not hesitate to ask!

Prizes: 1st - \$100 2nd - \$50 3rd - \$25 4th - 1 free milkshake from Farm Bureau

Judging: Ballot voting. The audience will vote for their favorite performance in each division. Each vote costs \$1, and there is no limit to how many votes one person can have.
