2019 Livestock Quiz Bowl & Skillathon Contest

Jackson and Trempealeau Counties had an impressive showing at the state Livestock Quiz Bowl and Skillathon Contests on Saturday, March 2, 2019! In the words of their coach Jessie Oberlin "I am soooooo proud of these kids because they work hard, they have fun, and they are a joy to take anywhere because they are so well mannered."

Jackson County had 18 youth competing: Morgan and Wyatt Berg, Frannie and Sam Everson, Luke Fischer, Doyle Hagen, Grace, Jake and Justin Kling, Austin, Jack and Trent Laufenberg, Morgan Lindow, Kaden Moseley, Austin Olson, Colby Sampson, Brewer Schlifer and Brenna Thorson. We had 3 junior teams and 1 mixed age team competing.

Out of 17 junior teams Jackson County's Junior team #1 (Jack Laufenberg, Jake Kling, Luke Fischer, Doyle Hagen and Austin Olson) placed 3rd in quiz bowl and 2nd in skillathon. Jake was 2nd high individual and Luke was 6th in skillathon.

Out of 9 mixed age teams Jackson County's team (Trent Laufenberg, Kaden Moseley, Grace Kling, Wyatt Berg and Austin Laufenberg) placed 2nd in both quiz bowl and skillathon. Grace was 3rd individual, Trent was 5th, Wyatt was 6th and Kaden was 9th in skillathon.

Out of 12 senior teams Trempealeau County's team (Mara Quarne, Blake Johnson, Tyler Johnson and Joie Haines) are the State Champions in both quiz bowl and skillathon. This qualifies them to compete at national contests this fall in Louisville and Nebraska. Individually in skillathon Mara was 2nd and Blake was 6th.

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2019 Dog Obedience Classes Set

Your opportunities for Dog Obedience Classes for you and your dog are coming up soon! Dog Obedience Classes will be held in Trempealeau County this Spring. The classes are offered by the County 4-H Dog Project Leaders for both 4-H Club members enrolled in the dog project and the general public. Anyone interested is encouraged to attend.

The first Dog Obedience Class this Spring will be held on **Monday, April 8, 2019 at 7:00 p.m.** in the Whitehall Memorial High School (Commons), Whitehall, WI. Enter through the main entrance in the front of the school. The first class is informational only and will include an orientation session, registration (class signup), a demonstration, agility class information, required equipment and dog health. **Do not bring dogs to the first class!** **CLASS SIZE COULD BE LIMITED – 4-H MEMBERS/YOUTH WILL**

HAVE PREFERENCE! Attend the April 8th, meeting to reserve your spot! Enrollment will not be accepted after April 30th, 2019! You may purchase equipment the first night training sessions begin. The remaining training sessions will be held at the Trempealeau County Fairgrounds in Galesville. There will NOT be classes in Whitehall this year. Detailed information will be available at the April 8th informational session. Beginner and Advanced Dog Obedience Classes as well as Agility will be held in Galesville. All Galesville training classes will be held on Mondays and will start on **Monday evening, April 22nd at 6:00 p.m.** Agility will start April 29th, 2019. Parental help with setup and take down of equipment will be required. (You must have completed an obedience class to participate in agility.) Rally and Showmanship will also be offered in June. The class fee for 4-H members will remain \$10.00; and non 4-H members (the general public) will remain \$40.00. Spectators are welcome!!

Equipment needed for the class will be a 6-Ft. leather or cotton web lead and a correctly sized nylon or chain training collar. The cotton web leads can be purchased at class for \$5.00 each; training collars are also available in all sizes for \$5.00. Anyone participating in agility is required to have a buckle collar without any tags attached to the collar.

Please bring a copy of current vaccination records with you to the first class – we are required to keep a copy for our records. All dogs must have distemper, rabies and parvovirus shots.



Any 4-H member who still wants to enroll in the Dog Project should contact the UW Extension Office in Whitehall at (715) 538-2311 Ext. 208 by April 9th. Remember we have Dog Obedience Open Class at the Fair so any adults interested can show their dog and participate at the Fair!

Becoming a 4-H Volunteer

4-H Volunteers are valued partners in working with our youth and help make 4-H possible. In order to volunteer, previous 4-H Youth Development experience is not necessary. The most important qualification is a desire to work with young people and help them grow through educational experiences and gain positive life skills. Please consider sharing your time and talents! Adult volunteers working together with youth make a difference in the lives of young people.

Volunteers work with UW-Extension professionals to develop the life skills of youth members, thus benefiting the state, employers, and the economy. Volunteers extend the resources of UW-Extension as they work with staff to deliver educational programs. Volunteering is a privilege. How does one become a volunteer? If you have not already done so, go to Wisconsin 4HOnline and create a family profile.

If your family is already in the system, do not create a new family profile, just make sure you are entered into your family account and check that you want to be a 4-H volunteer. Then sign-up to take the Online Mandated Reporter Training for 4-H Volunteers. After signing up for the Online Mandated Reporter Training sign up to attend a VIP Training session. Once you've completed your Online Mandatory Reporter training and VIP training, a background check will be conducted on you by the state and you will be contacted by GIS through e-mail requesting additional information needed in order for the state to conduct the background check.

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YQCA In-Person Training Dates

YQCA Training is required for some animal projects in order for them to be exhibited at the Trempealeau County Fair. If YQCA training is required, then all exhibitors must be YQCA certified through attending an in-person training OR through taking the training online at <https://yqca.learngrow.io/Account/Login>

All Trempealeau County in-person training dates have passed. However, you can look on the YQCA website to see if surrounding counties are having any in-person training sessions and attend those for credits if you do not want to complete the training online.

Exhibitors will also need to complete one additional educational event besides the YQCA Training. A **participation form for your additional educational requirement must be turned into the UW-Extension Office prior to July 1st.** The participation form can be found here:
