There is special activity insurance available to cover events like the Bruce Mound snow tubing event. The cost is \$.35 per child with a minimum of \$8.00. This is also available to clubs if hosting special events.

- 4-H Leaders' Association Training-A brief review of the training deemed it beneficial. The need for club officer training was discussed. Sarah proposed a multi county training session. A date that works for all clubs election schedules will be determined. There is also the potential for individual club training if needed.
