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4-H Club Meetings

Almost every 4-H club holds **regular** club meetings. Even within the same club, no two club meetings are the same. Ideally, every meeting should have three parts—**recreation (fun), business, and learning**. Youth leadership plays a huge role in the success of a club.

Most clubs have youth officers (president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and other selected roles) who are responsible for running each meeting. Youth leaders not only gain excellent life skills, they help to keep the meeting relevant and fun for members of all ages. All youth have a responsibility to contribute to their clubs through their voice and their actions!

What is **my role** as an adult?

Adults help create a safe, positive atmosphere for all 4-H members when they empower and encourage youth. While at a meeting, it's important to be a positive role model for everyone in attendance. Caring adults play an important role in the mental health of youth, and 4-H can help connect youth with positive adults.

Make this a **positive experience**.

1. Actively listen to all 4-H members.
2. Let youth run the meeting. It's their club!
3. Attend as many meetings as possible.
4. Ask your club leader how you can help.
5. If you have a hobby or skill, consider offering to be a guest speaker!

Should I **stay** or should I **go**?

It's strongly recommended that parents/guardians attend the 4-H meeting with your child. Club meetings provide great opportunities to learn with other club members, but the learning doesn't stop there. By attending the meeting, you can reflect on the meeting together and continue the education outside the club.

How is the meeting run?

Most 4-H clubs use **parliamentary procedure** to make club decisions. See if you can put the five steps of this procedure in order. Each step is written in **bold**. The answers are found at the bottom of the adult edition.

Re-state the Motion—The president restates the motion before the group votes.

1. _____

Discussion—The motion is discussed by all members. Members might want to bring up good or bad things about the motion, or maybe find some ways that it needs to be changed.

2. _____

Motion—A motion is a request that something can be done. Only one motion should be placed before the group at one time. A motion can be discussed and changed.

3. _____

Vote—The group votes to decide if they will pass or deny the motion. Voting usually happens by voice. Members say “aye” if they agree, and “nay” if they disagree. Voting sometimes happens in other ways (secret ballot, show of hands).

4. _____

Second—If someone agrees with the motion, they can “second the motion,” which means it can be discussed by all members.

5. _____

In Person Meeting Approval Process

As of July 1st 2020 in person meetings are possible! I have a post available on our website that gives you all of the details.

Here is a quick recap of some of the recent updates:

- As of June 2nd masks are not required for fully vaccinated participants. Please visit the website to review the details.
- Pod style meetings can happen outside (with up to 500 people) with no tie limit.
- In door meetings no size limit if participants are spaced 6 feet apart.
- Submitting Approval Forms is now very simple. Use the link to the google form once you submit the form you will get a receipt sent to your email of what you submitted. Your event will be approved instantly and I will get in contact with you if I have any questions.

VIP Training:

VIP or volunteers in preparation training is for anyone who wants to work with youth one-on-one and teach sessions like a project or club leader. If you have signed up to be a volunteer in 4-H Online and I have not approved you yet it might be because of this. Look for this symbol . This means that you will need to complete either VIP or mandated reporter training. Mandated reporter is an online course in 4-H Online that you can complete on your own time. VIP however, has to be taught by either myself or another educator either virtually or in person. This training covers many topics on how to create a safe environment for youth and takes about 90 minutes.



I prefer to do VIP trainings on weeknights in September-April because the rest of the year gets pretty busy for everyone especially in the summer.

Just a couple of 4-H Online reminders! You are still able to re-enroll. If you missed the December 1st deadline don't sweat! New members can join 4-H at anytime. And current members can still enroll through out the year.

- **Do not create a new account!** Use your old email and password from the old system to log in.
- If you are having trouble remembering either one please let me know!
- When re-enrolling be sure to update all of the projects your child is interested in right away. Projects are were I have seen the most issues in the system but it is easier to get them all taken care of right away then to wait.

Jackson County Fair Updates:

The Jackson County fair has a couple of updates to their fair book this year that you should be aware of. The fair book will be available online this year along with all of the forms you will need to complete entries. There will still be paper copies available but there will not be as many printed as in the past. The only change to the books will be that they will only have the rules, departments and entries. Cloverbud Leader:

Jackson County 4-H is looking for a Cloverbud Project Leader! Traditionally this person is an adult who plans Cloverbud project meetings during the year. This year we want to try something different, instead of having one adult be in charge of the whole program we want to encourage multiple youth to teach the program. This would be a great opportunity for an older youth to gain some teaching, leadership, and program planning skills. Here are some of the qualifications of requirements of this position:

- Youth can be 13-19 years of age. Younger youth will need a trusted adult to help them do the program.
- The individual will be in charge or planning the session, getting the description to me and teaching the session.
- The topic is your choice! If you need some help picking a topic I have curriculum you can use to help you plan and teach a session.
- On the day of the program the Youth leader will present their lesson and work with the youth to complete the program.

The number of sessions you teach are up to you! I want to have 4 sessions with this new model to get a good grasp and we will see where to go from there. If this sounds like something you might be interested in please let me know! I want to have Cloverbud programming planned for March-June .

Cook Book Sales:

Cook Books are still available for purchase! This fundraiser helps to support the programming that the Parents and Leaders do each year. The parents and Leaders ask that clubs help to sell the cook books. Clubs can pre-sell books by purchasing them at \$10 per book and then sell them at the same price. No Bake Bake Sale:

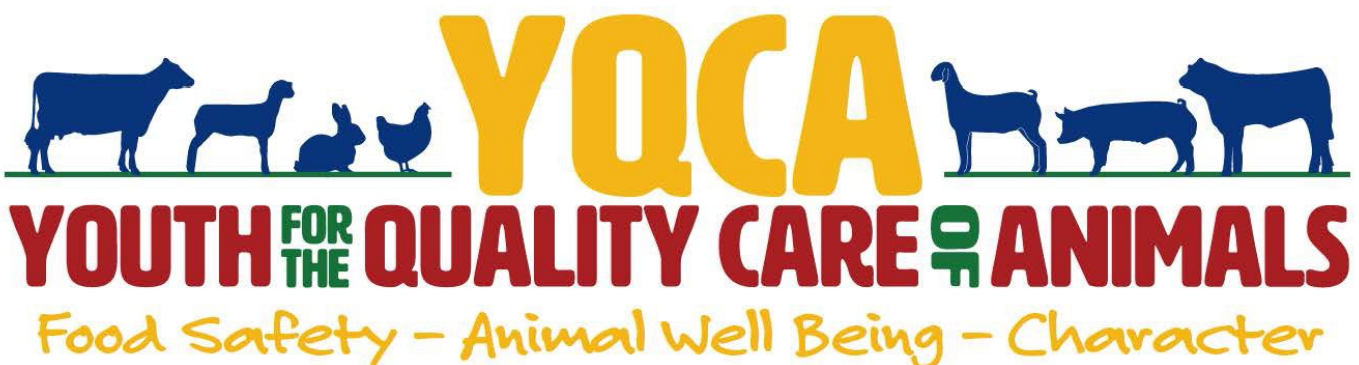
