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

CWF Registration:

Citizenship Washington Focus, or CWF for short, is the premier week-long 4-H citizenship and leadership experience. CWF brings 4-H delegations from all over the country to stay in Washington D.C., our Nation's Capital! Participants learn about the roles of Senators and Representatives in the United States government and how these parts work together to form an effective Congress. Additionally, youth get to see and experience government inaction by meeting with their State's members of Congress and watching a House of Representatives meeting. Delegates also participate in various educational workshops such as:

Citizenship Toolbox: By exploring what it means to be a good citizen, delegates identify their own skillset to become active citizens and leaders in their communities back home.

Congressional Issues: Delegates will have open discussions with different perspectives on real national issues in the government today.

Bill Writing: Delegates learn the process of writing a bill in the House of Representatives and then write one of their own. They then will hold a mock House of Representatives meeting where they will discuss and either pass or deny said bills.

Action Planning: By combining all of the skills they have learned at CWF, the entire delegation will discuss what issues are prominent in their communities. They will then develop a plan to take back and implement positive change in their hometowns.

These are just a couple of the activities delegates will participate in. Delegates will also get the opportunity to tour our Nation's Capital and experience the culture that comes with it. After completing the CWF program, they will have stronger knowledge about being an active citizen and our government. They will also have the opportunity to discover new skills and be exposed to different perspectives and cultures from around the U.S. On top of all this, it gives delegates another opportunity to bond and network with other 4-Hers from Wisconsin and beyond. We hope to see you participating in CWF in the near future!

VIP Training:

VIP or Volunteers in Preparation training is for anyone who wants to work with youth one-on-one and teach sessions like a project or club leader. If you have signed up to be a volunteer in 4-H Online and I have not approved you yet, it might be because of this. Look for this symbol. This symbol means that you must complete either VIP or mandated reporter training. The mandated reporter is an online course in 4-H Online that you can complete on your own time. VIP, however, has to be taught

by either myself or another educator virtually or in person. This training covers many topics on creating a safe environment for youth and takes about 90 minutes.

I prefer to do VIP training on weeknights in September-April because the rest of the year gets pretty busy for everyone, especially in the summer.



Dog Project Update:

Your opportunities for Dog Obedience Classes for you and your dog are coming up soon! Dog Obedience Classes will be held in Trempealeau County this Spring. The classes are offered by the County 4-H Dog Project Leaders for both 4-H Club members enrolled in the dog project and the community members.

The Dog Obedience Informational Class will be held on Monday, May 2, 2022, at 6:00 p.m. in the Whitehall Memorial High School - Commons Area, Whitehall, WI. Enter through the main entrance in the front of the school. The first class is informational only and will include an orientation session, registration (class signup), a demonstration, class information, required equipment and dog health. Do not bring dogs to the first class.! CLASS SIZE WILL BE LIMITED – 4-H MEMBERS/YOUTH WILL HAVE PREFERENCE! Attend the May 2nd, meeting or call a project leader to reserve your spot! Enrollment will not be accepted after May 11th, 2022! You may purchase equipment the first night training sessions begin.

Weekly training sessions for everyone's convenience will be held in both Whitehall and Galesville. The Whitehall Classes will be held at the old Whitehall Sunset Elementary School Lot, (next to the Whitehall High School), and in Galesville at the Fairgrounds. Detailed information will be available at the May 2nd informational session. Whitehall will offer a beginner class, it will be held on Monday evenings starting May 9th at 6:00 p.m. Beginner and Advanced Dog Obedience Classes will be held in Galesville. Galesville training classes will start on Wednesday evening, May 11th at 6:00 p.m. at the Fairgrounds. Classes will be held weekly through the end of June. (Agility times and dates will be determined after class participant interest is determined) Parental help with setup and take down of equipment will be required! (You must have completed an obedience class to participate in agility.) Rally and Showmanship will also be offered in Galesville in June (times to be determined). Fair brush up fun night will be held in Galesville at the Fairgrounds on Wednesday, July 6th, 2022, at 6pm. The training class fee for 4-H members will be \$25.00; and non 4-H members (the general public) will be \$60.00.

Equipment needed for the class will be a 6-Ft. leather or cotton web lead and a correctly sized nylon or chain training collar. The cotton web leads can be purchased at class; training collars are also available in all sizes. Anyone participating in agility is required to have a buckle collar without any tags attached to the collar.

Please bring a copy of current dog vaccination records with you. (copy to turn in) – we are required to keep a copy. All dogs must have a current distemper, rabies and parvovirus shots.

Any 4-H member who still wants to enroll in the Dog Project should contact the UW Extension Office in Whitehall at (715) 538-2311 Ext. 208. Remember we have the addition of Dog Obedience Open Class at the Fair so any adults interested can show their dog and participate at the Fair!
