Charter Updates and Workshops:

As the 4-H year comes to a close, we have to start looking at charters and the new 4-H year. Charters are due to the **Extension office on November 1**st. Here is a link to the updated version:

With some new club leaders this year and the updates with the charters, I have one, Charter Workshops that club leaders can are <u>canare able to</u> attend. The first one is on **August 16th at 6 pm at the Jackson County Extension Office**. The second one is on **August 23rd at 6 pm at Riverland Energy on Arcadia**. There will not be registration for these workshops but I will give you time to work on your charter and ask questions.

Another part of the Chartering process is the Annual Financial Report. This summarizes clubs checking and saving accounts for the entire year. These are due to the Extension Office on **September 1**st. There are a couple of critical pieces that need to be included with the annual financial report each year:

- 1. Annual Financial Report
- 2. Checklist
- 3. A copy of the bank statement ending on June 30 or July 1st for EACH account.
- 4. A current inventory of any land, buildings, property, or project equipment with individual values of \$1000 or greater. This is a good way to keep track of things your club has purchased and have a record of where it is.
- 5. Monthly Treasurers reports for 4-H Clubs or Groups with annual income greater or equal to \$20,000.

At first glance, this may seem like a lot of paperwork, but this is how our clubs and groups keep their tax-exempt status. Failure to complete this will result in a loss of tax-exempt status. This will be covered during the Charter Workshop so please bring questions and your treasurer paperwork!

Charters and Annual Financial Reports are incredibly important. This is how clubs plan out their year, audit their finances, and report how they used their funds the year before. If you have questions about them, please let Andrea know!

National 4-H Week:

National 4- H week is **October 2-8**th. This year I want people to hear what 4-H is like from the member's perspective! In the past, we have partnered with WHTL to feature members' interviews on the radio. I want to have 20 youth call in or do an in-person interview with WHTL, which will get featured throughout the first week of October.

Who can call in? Anyone! I would love a mix of youth and adult leaders. This is a great opportunity for youth to practice their interviewing skills! It is a low-pressure interview with only Steve, WHTL employee.

4-H Re-Enrollment:

On September first, 4-H Online will go offline to prepare for the new 4-H year. If you plan to stay enrolled in 4-H for 2022-2023, you can re-enroll on **September 15**th. Enrollment is important! This is how I make mailing lists and out project members lists to leaders, and contact members. Please make sure to enroll members by **December 1**st. I will keep including members from last year's list until December 1st. After that, you will have to be currently enrolled to be included in any communication.

When reenrolling, please take the time to update any ways you want to receive communication. Here is a list of what I am talking about:

- Email addresses
- · Any parent/guardian numbers that should be included.

If you need to have your password changed or updated, please either email or call Andrea. She can reset passwords and change your main email address in case you want it to be a different one.

VIP Training:

VIP or Volunteers in Preparation training is for anyone who wants to work with youth one-on-one and teach sessions like a project or club leader. If you have signed up to be a volunteer in 4-H Online and I have not approved you yet, it is because of this. Look for this symbol. This symbol means that you must complete either VIP or mandated reporter training.

The mandated reporter is an online course in 4-H Online that you can complete on your own time. VIP, however, has to be taught by either myself or another educator virtually or in person. This training covers topics like creating a safe environment for youth, insurance, what to do in an emergency, and more. It takes about 90 minutes.

I prefer to do VIP training on weeknights in September-May because the rest of the year gets pretty busy for everyone, especially in the summer.

4-H Club Meetings

Almost every 4-H club holds **regular** club meetings. Even within the same club, no two club meetings are the same. Ideally, every meeting should have three parts—**recreation** (fun), business, and learning. Youth leadership plays a huge role in the success of a club.

Most clubs have youth officers (president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and other selected roles) who are responsible for running each meeting. Youth leaders not only gain excellent life skills, they help to keep the meeting relevant and fun for members of all ages. All youth have a responsibility to contribute to their clubs through their voice and their actions!

What is my role as an adult?

Adults help create a safe, positive atmosphere for all 4-H members when they empower and encourage youth. While at a meeting, it's important to be a positive role model for everyone in attendance. Caring adults play an important role in the mental health of youth, and 4-H can help connect youth with positive adults.

Make this a positive experience.

- 1. Actively listen to all 4-H members.
- 2. Let youth run the meeting. It's their club!
- 3. Attend as many meetings as possible.
- 4. Ask your club leader how you can help.
- 5. If you have a hobby or skill, consider offering to be a guest speaker!

Should I stay or should I go?

It's strongly recommended that parents/guardians attend the 4-H meeting with your child. Club meetings provide great opportunities to learn with other club members, but the learning doesn't stop there. By attending the meeting, you can reflect on the meeting together and continue the education outside the club.

How is the meeting run?

Most 4-H clubs use **parliamentary procedure** to make club decisions. See if you can put the five steps of this procedure in order. Each step is written in **bold**. The answers are found at the bottom of the adult edition.

Re-state the Motion—The president restates the motion before the group votes.	1.
Discussion —The motion is discussed by all members. Members might want to bring up good or bad things about the motion, or maybe find some ways that it needs to be changed.	2.
Motion —A motion is a request that something can be done. Only one motion should be placed before the group at one time. A motion can be discussed and changed.	3.
Vote—The group votes to decide if they will pass or deny the motion. Voting usually happens by voice. Members say "aye" if they agree, and "nay" if they disagree. Voting sometimes happens in other ways (secret ballot, show of hands).	4. 5.
