Charter Updates:

As the 4-H year comes to a close, we are looking at charters and the new 4-H year. Charters are due to the **Extension office on November 1**st. Here is a link to the updated version:

With some new club leaders this year and the updates with the charters, I have one, Charter Workshops, that club leaders can attend. The first one is on **September 22nd, from 6-8 pm at the Jackson County UW Extension Office**. There will not be registered for these workshops, but I will give you time to work on your charter and ask questions.

Another part of the Chartering process is the Annual Financial Report. This summarizes clubs checking and saving accounts for the entire year. These are due to the Extension Office on **September** 1st. There are a couple of critical pieces that need to be included in the annual financial report each year:

- 1. Annual Financial Report
- 2. <u>Checklist</u>
- 3. A copy of the bank statement ending on June 30 or July 1^{st} for EACH account.
- 4. A current inventory of any land, buildings, property, or project equipment with individual values of \$1000 or greater. This is a good way to keep track of things your club has purchased and has a record is.
- 5. Monthly Treasurers reports for 4-H Clubs or Groups with annual income greater or equal to \$20,000.

VIP Training:

VIP or Volunteers in Preparation training is for anyone who wants to work with youth one-on-one and teach sessions like a project or club leader. If you have signed up to be a volunteer in 4-H Online and I have yet to approve you, it is because of this. You must complete either VIP (in-person Training), mandated reporter training (Online), and Titel IX Training(Online). Iwill shift towards less pre-scheduled VIP trainings and more to working with your schedule. I am also willing to come to club meetings and training adults there!Please get in touch with Andreaa if you are intrested in scheduling a VIP training!

The mandated reporter is an online course in 4-H Online that you can complete on your own time. VIP, however, has to be taught by either myself or another educator virtually or in person. This training covers topics like creating a safe environment for youth, insurance, what to do in an emergency, and more. It takes about 90 minutes.

I prefer to do VIP training on weeknights in September-May because the rest of the year gets pretty busy for everyone, especially in the summer.



4-H Re-Enrollment:

On September first, 4-H Online will go offline to prepare for the new 4-H year. If you plan to stay enrolled in 4-H for 2022-2023, you can re-enroll on **September 15th**. Enrollment is important! This is how I make mailing lists and out project members list to leaders and contact members. Please make sure to enroll members by **December 1st**. I will keep including members from last year's list until December 1st. After that, you will have to be currently enrolled to be included in any communication.

When reenrolling, please take the time to update any ways you want to receive communication. Here is a list of what I am talking about:

- Email addresses
- Any parent/guardian numbers that should be included.

Parents and guardians do not need to sign up for 4-H Online unless they want to volunteer. If you are in any of the following roles, be sure to re-enroll:

- Club leader
- Project volunteer

A general rule of thumb is that if you have access to club funds (the checkbook) or are planning to work with youth, you should become a certified 4-H volunteer. If you have any questions about this, please contact Andrea.

State 4-H Gymkhana:

The 2022 State 4-H Gymkhana was held on Saturday, September 10th, at the State Fairgrounds in West Allis, Wisconsin. Two Trempealeau County Horse Project members competed at this year's event, Jenessa Perry, daughter of Travis & Jennifer Perry, and Savannah Hynes, daughter of Zach & Katrina Hynes.

Jenessa has been a member of the Lincoln Pioneers since 2015 and is in her 2nd year at UW-River Falls. This was her final year in 4-H, and what a year it has been with her pony, Angel. Not only did she set new personal records in four of the six gymkhana events, but she received an invitation to compete in the Champions Challenge Horse Show this past August at the State Fairgrounds. Participation in this event is by invitation only from the Wisconsin State Fair with counsel from the Wisconsin 4-H Horse Project Leaders after the completion of the State Horse Shows



the year prior. This was Jenessa and Angel's third trip to state, where they were



5timese Top Ten finalists which included a Reserve Champion in the Plug Race. Eachof her classes consisted of 12 competitors and at State, the ponies are not separated from the horses in the competition.

Sevannah has been in 4-H since the second grade and is a member of the Ettrick Eagles and a Senior at G-E-T High School. Sevannah was faced with using her back up horse, Rambler, this season and this was the first state competition

for them both. Sevannah took the horse change in stride, even facing some adversity early on in the season, but she and Rambler have really clicked and it showed on Saturday. Facing 13 competitors in each of her six classes she came home with five Top Ten's and a Top Five in the Flag Race.

Volunteering: How Can You Help?



Volunteers are a huge part of the success of 4-H and help make 4-H possible. 4-H volunteers can serve as club leaders, project leaders, chaperones, and other roles. While the experience level of volunteers varies, our volunteers have one thing in common: wanting to make a positive difference in the lives of young people. In addition to making a positive impact with youth, 4-H volunteers gain important life skills of their own and also impact the communities in which they volunteer.

Becoming a 4-H Volunteer

To ensure volunteers in the 4-H program are prepared and to protect the safety and best interests of 4-H members, all 4-H volunteers who are 18 years of age and older who are no longer members go through a process which includes:

- 1. Participate in training to help you serve in your role. This training is called Volunteers in Preparation,
- 2. Have a background check.
- 3. Agree to conduct yourself in a way that positively represents 4-H.
- 4. Learn how to keep our youth safe by taking a Mandated Reporter Training.



To get started on your volunteer journey, contact your local 4-H educator.

Wisconsin 4-H Volunteer Roles

There are many ways to volunteer in 4-H. All volunteers work with youth and adult volunteers to offer a positive youth development experience for youth. Wisconsin's 4-H program has six main roles for volunteers.

- Activity/Event Volunteers lead or organize a 4-H activity or event.
- Adult Advisor/Chaperones work with 4-H educators to chaperone a 4-H educational experience.
- Club Enrollment Coordinator leads and supports enrollment in a club or group.
- Club Leader provides leadership for a club or group organization.
- Committee Volunteers help lead or participate as a member of a committee.
- Project Leaders provide leadership and organization to a group learning about a specific topic.
- There may be additional trainings to volunteer in some of these roles, for example a WI 4-H Shooting Sports Leader

Can I help without volunteering?

Not everyone feels ready to become a 4-H volunteer. Check in with your club leader or local 4-H educator to find out other ways you can still make an impact on the program without serving 4-H in an official capacity. This might mean providing no-contact support in a warm welcoming way such as bringing a healthy snack, set up and clean up, detc. Any help you give makes the experience more positive for everyone.

Helping Hands

The 4-H pledge talks about using your hands for larger service. Not only can you use your hands to help your club through leadership and teaching, but you can use your hands to help your community too! 4-H members are known for helping their community through service. Plan your own community service project by answering the questions below!

Who needs (or would benefit from) help?

Choose an organization (example: animal shelter or food pantry), group of people (people who are elderly), or a person who you'd like to help (a neighbor).

How can I help?

List skills (example: art or building), interests (being outside), or abilities (talking to other people) that you want to use to make a difference.

What tasks need to get done?

Match the "how" with the "who"! Write what you need to do to complete your project and the supplies you'll need to accomplish it. (Example: If you are creating cards for people in a senior living facility, you will need to contact the facility, gather writing supplies, create the cards, and deliver the cards.)



How did it go?

After you've done your community service project, reflect on how things went and how you might do things differently if you did it again. What went well? What could be better?

Almost every club does a community service project. At your next club meeting, ask a club officer or your club leader what project your club is doing this year!
