

VIP Training

VIP or Volunteers in Preparation training is for anyone who wants to work with youth one-onone and teach sessions like a project or club leader. If you have signed up to volunteer in 4-H Online and I have yet to approve you, it is because of this: You must complete either VIP (inperson Training), mandated reporter training (Online), or Title IX Training (Online).

I will shift towards less pre-scheduled VIP training and more to working with your schedule. I am also willing to come to club meetings and train adults there! Please contact me if you are interested in scheduling a VIP training!

The mandated reporter is an online course in 4-H Online that you can complete over time. VIP, however, has to be taught by either myself or another educator virtually or in person. This training covers topics like creating a safe environment for youth, insurance, what to do in an emergency, and more. It takes about 90 minutes. I prefer to do VIP training on weeknights in September-May because the rest of the year gets pretty busy for everyone, especially in the summer. Want more information about VIPs? E-mail me! 2023 Wisconsin 4-H Quiz Bowl and Skillathon Results

(Madison, WI) The Wisconsin 4-H Quiz Bowl and Skillathon contests were both held on Saturday, March 25th at the University of Wisconsin Madison Animal Sciences Building. Livestock Quiz Bowl is a competition where questions are about beef, sheep, swine and meat goat topics and students use a buzzer in order to answer. Teams compete in a double elimination format by giving oral answers to questions posed by a judge. Each match has both an individual and toss-up question round. A group discussion round is included in the senior division to simulate the national competition.

The Senior Quiz Bowl winner represents Wisconsin at the National 4-H Quiz Bowl contest at the North American International Livestock Exposition in Louisville, KY in November. The winning team of the senior division (14 years of age or older) was Marathon County. Members included: Alison Leonard, Alexa Leonard, Madison Heise, Mason Heise, and Kyla Heise.

Second place in Senior Quiz Bowl went to Grant County: Jessica Patterson, Cameron Patterson, Luke Patterson, Libby Vogt, Michael Edgington.

Winner of the Junior Quiz Bowl division (under 14 years old) was Sheboygan County. Members included Audrey Gartman, Olivia Kohlman, Leo Gartman, Ellie Seifert, and Cora Cowhig.

Second place went to Iowa County. Members include: Caleb Formo, Riley Sennhenn, and Cole Schauff

Winner of the Mixed division (which must contain at least one youth from each age division) was Jackson County. Team members included: Morgan Lindow, Amara Streff, Morgan Berg, Brenna Thorson, Julia Brown.

Grant County was second place. Members included: Iris Adams, Gwen Reidl, Aiden Patterson, and Leah Patterson.

In the Skillathon contest, participants complete a 25-question written test, 4 individual skill-athon stations where contestants take part in livestock breed identification, feed identification, equipment identification and meat identification. The final portion is the team exercises where each team works together to best solve 4 different scenarios involving live animals and animal management concepts. This phase helps youth learn problem solving, critical thinking and teamwork.

The winning 4-H Skillathon team was from Grant County team and will represent Wisconsin at the National 4-H Skillathon Contest in Louisville, KY in November. Members included: Cameron Patterson, Luke Patterson, Libby Vogt, and Michael Edgington.

Second place senior team was Sheboygan County team which included Ethan Kohlman, Kathryn Schwartz, Chloe Bruenig. The top Ten Overall Senior Skillathon Individuals were: Cameron Patterson (Grant), Libby Vogt (Grant), Luke Fisher (Jackson), Jake Kling (Jackson), Ethan Kohlman (Sheboygan), Alison Leonard (Marathon), Luke Patterson (Grant), Chloe Breunig (Sheboygan), Lindsey Schmoll (Marathon), Candace Lein (Portage).

Sheboygan County topped the junior division. Members included: Audrey Gartman, Olivia Kohlman, Leo Gratman, Ellie Seifert, and Cora Cowhig. Second place was Iowa County. Team members are Caleb Formo, Riley Sennhenn, Cole Schauff.

Explore your Sparks in art & STEM! Join us for Weaving Patterns, Weaving Materials, and Weaving Light. We will have three virtual sessions on May 9, 16, & 23. Register here: https://go.wisc.edu/u9nz46

Registration closes on April 27 (or when the maximum number of participants is reached.)

Sessions are aimed at those in 5th grade and up. Helloloom developed them! Creator and professor of design at UW-Madison, Marianne Fairbanks; UW-Madison STEM outreach specialist, Tom Zinnen; and 4-H Program Educator in Eau Claire County, Rachel Hart-Brinson. Each session will build on the previous one, but you will have access to a recording to watch the ones you may have missed.

Supplies will be sent to you or your County's Extension Office after registration closes on April 27.

Thanks to a Baldwin Grant, there is no cost for this program.

Session descriptions are below:

WEAVING PATTERNS

Learn how to weave using a small hand-held loom! You will learn how to weave with multiple colors, explore patterns, and create a fun and colorful woven creation!

We will begin with a quick paper weaving to learn new patterns, including plain weave, several twills, and basket weave. Students will learn the definition of warp and weft and how patterns make the weaving balanced, warp-faced, or weft-faced. Once you weave these patterns, you will notice them in woven garments and upholstery fabrics.

Ultimately students are encouraged to play with patterns and colors to see what combinations they can invent!



Wisconsin Dairy Goat Association Share a Kid Scholarship:

Share-a-Kid Application Information

Each year, the Wisconsin Dairy Goat Association promotes interest in dairy goats in our State. One of the ways we encourage our young people in this aspect of agriculture is through our

Share-a-Kid Program. We award an average of 4 to 6 dairy goat kids to young people across the

State each year.

This is a competitive statewide contest. The youth applicant will write an essay of 100 words or more about why they would like to have a dairy goat, how they will take care of her (food, shelter, and medical care), and if they have ever raised a goat. We also want to know why they want to raise a goat and what they love about goats. If the youth is new to raising goats, please include who your mentor is. This is a very competitive contest, and we want you to put much effort into your essay. Spelling and content count. The essay can include drawings, photos, or anything special things that you would like to include. Please keep a copy of your essay because no essays will be returned. If you are selected as a winner of a kid, your essay will be given to the donor. While we make every attempt to award winners one of their breeds of choice, if those breeds are not available, the Wisconsin Dairy Goat Association reserves the right to offer another breed to the winner. Share-a-Kid winners are not required to return a doe kid to the program, but we encourage them to do so. Rules:

- Youth must enter between 10 and 17 by January of this year.
- Entries are accepted from January 1st until April 1st of this year.
- The entry form and all required signatures must accompany the essay.
- Youth must be members of 4-H, FFA, WDGA, or other agricultural groups.
- Only one goat may be awarded per family per year. However, siblings are encouraged to enter.
- Youth may only win one time.
- Winners must show their goat at County Fair or in an open class goat show this year or the following depending on when fair entries close.
- If, under any circumstance, the kid received through the program is to be sold or rehomed, the individual or party who donated the kid will retain the first right of refusal.
- Youth who receive a kid must give updates to those who donated their kid at both six months and 12 months after the kid is received.
- A thank you (letter, card, etc.) should be given to the individual or party who donated your kid at the time of pick up.

A photo should be taken at the time of pick up of the youth, donor, and donated kid. Please send a digital copy of the picture to Share-a-Kid Chair.

The deadline to submit your application/essay is no later than April 1, 2023. All applicants will be notified of the results by May 1st, 2023. If you have any questions on this process, please get in touch with Share-a-Kid Chair Andrew Puetz @
