VIP Training

VIP or Volunteers in Preparation training is for anyone who wants to work with youth one-on-one and teach sessions like a project or club leader. If you have signed up to volunteer in 4-H Online and I have yet to approve you, it is because of this: You must complete either VIP (inperson Training), mandated reporter training (Online), or Title IX Training (Online).

I will shift towards less pre-scheduled VIP training and more to working with your schedule. I am also willing to come to club meetings and train adults there! Please contact me if you are interested in scheduling a VIP training!

The mandated reporter is an online course in 4-H Online that you can complete over time. VIP, however, has to be taught by either myself or another educator virtually or in person. This training covers topics like creating a safe environment for youth, insurance, what to do in an emergency, and more. It takes about 90 minutes. I prefer to do VIP training on weeknights in September-May because the rest of the year gets pretty busy for everyone, especially in the summer. Want more information about VIPs? E-mail me! Here is the link to the State 4-H Policies. This sheet has updates for a number of Wisconsin 4-H policies that have been updated like Bank accounts, Chaperones, Membership Dues and Fees Cash awards and prizes, and more!

What are Charters?

Charters are an annual report that club leaders fill out detailing the club's SMART Goals, Annual activities, high-risk activities, and meeting times and locations. This form may seem like a silly task but it is essential. I use this information to update our website with current club leaders and meeting locations. This process is important because it gives a club or group permission from the state to use the 4-H name and emblem.

This process has been updated in the past couple of years and is now available online! It is also something that can be filled out during a club meeting. Giving members a chance to create club-wide goals and talk about activities they want to participate in during the year is a great way to lighten the load of a club leader and give youth officers/members a leadership opportunity.

Charters are always released on August 1st and due to me on **November 1st**. This document can be submitted to the office as a paper copy or emailed electronically.

I have sessions in the fall to help club leaders complete their charters and ask questions. I have had low attendance the past couple of years, if this is something you are interested in please reach out to me.



What is the Annual Financial Report?

The annual financial report is a document that clubs submit to track their year of finances. It is a way to keep clubs accountable for spending and make sure that we are using sound fundraising and spending practices. This document seems daunting but if proper records were kept throughout the year it should be straightforward. Here is a list of the **REQUIRED** documents to accompany the Annual Financial Document:


- 1. Wisconsin 4-H Clubs and Groups Annual Financial Report
- 2. Wisconsin 4-H Clubs and Groups Audit Checklist
- 3. A Copy of the checkbook and or savings account registry covering July 1- June 30th
- 4. A copy of the Bank statement ending June 30 or July 1 for each account. Any differences between the bank statements and the ending balance reported must be reconciled and reconciliation must be uploaded with the annual financial report.
- 5. A current inventory of land, Buildings, Property, or project equipment with individual values of \$2,000 or greater
- 6. Monthly Treasurers Reports for 4-H Clubs or Groups with annual income greater or equal to \$20,000.

I have been very relaxed about the submissions in the past couple of years but this year I am going to be expecting more from club leaders who are submitting this form. The top four mistakes:

- 1. Signatures for both youth and adults on **ALL** the pages.
- 2. Having someone audit your annual financial report that is **NOT** related to the current account signer.
- 3. Not submitting a copy of the checkbook/ savings registry.
- 4. Submitting Annual Financial report paperwork that is out of date.

These are due to me or my office by **September 1st**. If all of these documents are not submitted by the deadline the club or group can lose tax-exempt status, forfeiture of all financial assets, and non-renewal of the 4-H Club or Group Charter. This also means that the IRS gets involved if this is not submitted.

The paperwork is available on the state 4-H. I make sure to only share a link to the state website as it will always have the list of required and current paperwork.

I often get this question: "Can I be added to your newsletter list?". You must enroll or re-enroll in 4-H Online to be on the mailing list. This is where I pull my lists from. Before sending out large emails, I update this list.

Check your SPAM folder if you have enrolled in 4-H Online but have not seen an email lately. I switched email systems to avoid this issue, but I need your help. This will help keep you connected and informed!


National 4-H Week:

As the 4-H new year is starting back up again here is a reminder about all of the cool travel programs that the state 4-H Program has to offer. Here is a short list of some popular programs that your child should definitely look into. Below is a link to the State Website so you can explore these opportunities more.



American Spirit:

Who can go: youth in grades 8-10 Cost \$1,900

Youth get to experience historical sights on the East Coast firsthand! This 10-day bus journey will stop at some amazing places like Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, New York, New York, Boston, Massachusetts, and Niagara Falls Canada!

Citizenship Washington Focus:

Who can go: 4-H Members in 10-12th grades Minimum age 15 during the experience Cost\$1750

Citizen Washington Focus or CWF is a great opportunity for youth who want to experience our national government in action. Youth from all over the nation come together in Washington D.C. to learn more about our Senators and representatives and how they come together to make laws. They will also participate in workshops about citizenship, Congressional Issues, Bill writing, and Action Planning.





National 4-H Conference

Who can go: 8-10 4-H youth in 10-12th grade.

Cost \$1,500

This Educational experience included selected youth from the nation who came together in Washington D.C. to help strengthen the national 4-H program. Ideas that come from this program are shared with the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture after each conference.

Space Camp

Who can go: 6-8th Grades with a Maximum age of 15 at the time of the trip. Cost \$900

This educational Experience is out of this world! Participants get to experience a simulated Space Mission, building and launching their own rocket, accommodations simulating real space training experience, and learning all about space exploration and astronaut life.

Summer Academy

Who can go: 7-up Grades

Cost \$350

Formally Wisconsin Youth Conference, this educational experience is held at UW-Madison during June. The difference between this and the youth conference is the focus on post-secondary education. Youth pick one of 7 tracks to explore during the experience like Agriculture & and animal sciences, Art and communication, Culinary and Health, Human Services, Leadership and civic Engagement, Trades, and STEM(Science, Technology, Engineering, and math).







Travel Abroad

Who can go: Age 12-18 depending on the country.

The cost depends on the program.

Youth can experience different countries and cultures. Here are some of the places you can explore, Costa Rica, Japan (4-8 weeks), South Korea, and Taiwan. Counties are on a rotating cycle and change every couple of years.

Art Beat

Who can go: 3-5th Grades, parents welcome. Cost \$125 for youth, \$75 for Chaperones

4-H Art Beat is the introductory program for Wisconsin 4-H Communication Arts and was created for 4-H members in grades 3-5, their parents, and leaders. Art Beatl provides an opportunity for youth and their parents to experience five different art forms in a camping environment at Camp Upham Woods in Wisconsin Dells. Art Beat! track leaders are older 4-H Youth, 4-H Leaders, and staff.

Arts Camp

Who can go: 6-8th Grades

Cost \$100 Youth \$55 Chaperones

4-H Arts Camp provides youth in grades 6-8 an opportunity to explore different types of art including theater, music, visual arts, dance, and photography while making new friends, developing skills, and enjoying new experiences.

The purpose of Arts Camp:

- Encouraging expression and participation in the arts with middle school-age youth
- Supporting youth teaching opportunities where they learn to incorporate education, creativity, and reflection into the creative process
- Increasing awareness of the arts and participation in the arts at the club level

Fall Forum

Who can go: 7-13th Grade and adult chaperones. The cost depends on how you spend the night and how many meals you will eat.


