## Pesticide applicator training

Welcome to 2024! The only thing that does not change is change. Pesticide applicator training is a good example of change as we are once again seeing a change in how this is administered. You must order your manual online. We do not sell them in the Extension office. Go to the UW PAT (Pesticide Applicator Training) store at <a href="https://patstore.wisc.edu/secure/home">https://patstore.wisc.edu/secure/home</a> page down and select the blue private applicator tab. You should see this screen:



Click on the 100/101 General Farming tab to order your book. When you have completed your order, click on Training Classes to select the training class you want to attend. There are several around the state and the sessions are listed in alphabetical order by county. Sign up for the session you wish to attend. We do not do registrations at the local office.

## Grain quality

Check your grain in storage often this winter and spring. Grain that was grown in a stressful environment is more prone to cracks in the seed coat and other issues that can increase the amount of fine and broken kernels in the grain. Fines in the grain will restrict air movement in the bins and can increase the chances of mold and insects doing further damage to the grain.

Moldy and damaged grain can plug unloading equipment and cause bridging in the bins. Grain that does not flow through unloading equipment is the number one reason for people entering bins. People that enter bins with bridging grain have a high chance of being entrapped and injured or killed. Grain bin entrapments increase in the spring following a stressful growing season. Be diligent. Monitor your grain.
