Training Reminder for Volunteers

Are you in the process of enrolling in 4-H Online? If you haven't received your confirmation email yet, don't worry! Here are a few steps to ensure everything is on track:

Complete Your Trainings: These trainings are a fantastic opportunity to prepare you for your role and ensure the safety and well-being of the youth you'll be working with.

Background Check: This is an important step to protect both you and the participants. Completing it helps create a safe and supportive environment for everyone.

Check Your Email: Sometimes, confirmation emails can sneak into your spam or junk folder, so it's a good idea to check there too.

If you've done all this and still haven't received a confirmation, try logging back into your 4-H Online account to check your status, or reach out to your local 4-H office. They're there to help and support you! Some trainings take a little bit to be submitted into 4-H Online but you have to be sure the trainings are complete.

You're doing great, and your dedication to becoming a 4-H volunteer is truly appreciated. Keep going, and soon you'll be making a positive impact on the lives of many young people!

Olivia Matchey of Independence, a member of Lincoln Pioneers 4-H Club received a Speckled Park Heifer through the Minnesota Youth Beef Experience Program (MYBEP). Each year cattle producers from across the region generously donate heifers to young cattle enthusiasts get their feet wet in the beef business.

Each MYBEP winner is responsible for raising, breeding and maintaining complete records on care of the animal, while providing monthly progress reports to the original owner and the Minnesota Beef Expo. MYBEP recipients must also commit to participating at the Expo in the following year. The breeders who donated heifers will serve as mentors to the MYBEP youth and help guide them through their first year as cattle owners.

YQCA Sessions Available

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a requirement to sell your market animal at the Trempealeau County Fair. This program is available both online and in person. The cost is \$3 for in-person sessions and \$12 for online sessions. Registration is required. Please visit the YQCA website to register and complete the pre-test. There are **25 spots per session**, be sure to save your spot by registering before the program.

Additional Information:

Eligibility: The program is open to youth of all ages involved in animal agriculture.

Certification: Upon completion, participants will receive a certificate valid for one year.

Topics Covered: The training includes animal welfare, food safety, and proper animal handling techniques.

Benefits: Completing the YQCA program ensures that youth are knowledgeable about best practices in animal care, which can enhance the quality of their market animals and improve their chances of success at the fair.

4-H Meats Judging Contest

Mark your calendars for the upcoming State 4-H Meats Judging Contest on Saturday, February 8, 2025. If you have participated in the past - or this is the first time you are hearing about the contest, we would love to have you join us for this day of learning, fun, and competition.

What is the 4-H Meats Judging Contest? Have you been to your local meat market or grocery store lately and think you could choose the best cut of meat out of the case? Have you ever watched a live animal contest and thought you could choose what animals would provide the best meat products? This is your opportunity to put those skills to work. This contest tests the knowledge of youth in the placement of carcass and retail cut classes, carcass grading, and retail cut identification. Top senior teams earn the opportunity to compete at national competitions.

Who can participate? You must be a currently enrolled WI 4-H member to participate in this contest.

Junior – Age 8-13 as of January 1, 2025. Youth must be in or completed 3rd grade, 8-year-old Cloverbuds **cannot** participate.

Senior – Age 14-18 as of January 1, 2025. (Sr. team members cannot exceed grade 12, regardless of age)

Grade 13 Members - WI 4-H members that are in the 13th grade are eligible to compete at this state contest as individuals but not as a member of a team.

Even if your county has not participated in the past, round-up some 4-H friends and take advantage of this fun opportunity to show your knowledge of the animal species and industry.

Registration is opening this week for CWF 2025! Registration will be open from December 20, 2024-January 15, 2025 for youth currently in grades 10-12. You can register under the "events" tab in your 4HOnline profile. Learn more about CWF below!

Citizenship Washington Focus, or CWF for short, is the premier week long 4-H citizenship and leadership experience. CWF brings 4-H delegations from all over the country to stay in Washington D.C., our Nation's Capital! Participants learn about the roles of Senators and Representatives in the United States' government and how these parts work together to form an effective Congress. Additionally, youth get to see and experience government in action by meeting with their State's members of Congress and watching a House of Representatives meeting. Delegates also participate in various educational workshops such as:

Citizenship Toolbox: By exploring what it means to be a good citizen, delegates identify their own skill set to become active citizens and leaders in their communities back home.

Congressional Issues: Delegates will have open discussions with different perspectives on real national issues in the government today.


Bill Writing: Delegates learn the process of writing a bill in the House of Representatives and then write one of their own. They then will hold a mock House of Representatives meeting where they will discuss and either pass

or deny said bills.

Action Planning: By combining all of the skills they have learned at CWF, the entire delegation will discuss what issues are prominent in their communities. They will then develop a plan to take back and implement positive change into their hometowns.

These are just a couple of the activities delegates will participate in. Delegates will also get the opportunity to tour our Nation's Capital and experience the culture that comes with it. After completing the CWF program, they will have stronger knowledge about being an active citizen and our Government. They will also have the opportunity to discover new skills and be exposed to different perspectives and cultures from around the U.S. On top of all this, it gives delegates another opportunity to bond and network with other 4-Hers from Wisconsin and beyond.
