## 4-H Parade Policy

Parade season is right around the corner! Here is Wisconsin 4-H's Parade Policy:

Wisconsin 4-H is committed to providing safe and healthy environments for youth and adults participating in 4-H programs and activities. Preparing floats and participating in parades can be a fun way to promote 4-H, AND there are risks associated with these activities. The <u>4-H Parades Policy</u> outlines expectations for managing risk associated with vehicles used in parades, as well as youth and adults riding on vehicles or walking in the parade.



Before you plan your roadside clean up day look at this policy!

Regardless of the road (including state highways, county highways, streets, etc.) 4-H Clubs and Groups must follow the <u>Wisconsin Department of Transportation</u> rules/guidelines, youth volunteers must be at least 11 years of age or in the 6th grade, to participate in roadside clean-ups. Please note that counties or local municipalities may set stricter rules that must be followed. 4-H Clubs and Groups should consider alternative lower risk community service clean-up projects like parks, hiking trails, etc.


